Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are

James 2:5 (NIV) (p.1/3)

6 But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who are exploiting you?

Are they not the ones who are dragging you into court?

7 Are they not the ones who are blaspheming the noble name of him to whom you belong?

James 2:6-7 (NIV) (p.2/3)

8 If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right.

9 But if you show favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as lawbreakers.



The commandments,

"You shall not commit adultery,"

"You shall not murder,"

"You shall not steal,"

"You shall not covet,"

and whatever other command there may be,

Romans 13:9 (NIV) (p.1/2)

are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Love does **no harm** to a neighbor. Therefore love is the **fulfillment** of the law.

Romans 13:10 (NIV) (p.2/2)

Speak and act as those who will be judged by the law that gives freedom ...

James 2:12 (NIV)



If I want God to show mercy, do show mercy?
