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# What kind of prayer does God answer?

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The next day as they were leaving Bethany, Jesus was hungry.

13 Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit.

When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs.

14 Then he said to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again."

And his disciples heard him say

Mark 11:13-14 (ESV) (p.2/5)

20 As they passed by in the morning, they saw the fig tree withered away to its roots.

21 And Peter remembered and said to him, "Rabbi, look! The fig tree that you cursed has withered."

Mark 11:20-21 (ESV) (p.3/5)

22 And Jesus answered them, "Have faith in God.

23 Truly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, Be taken up and thrown into the sea,'

and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that what he says will come to pass, it will be done for him.



24 Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

25 And whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone,

so that your Father also who is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses."


